Last summer, I was elected a delegate of the Michigan Conference for a four year term, which means I will attend and vote in two Synods. The next one will be in Long Beach, California in 2013.

Synod is an awesome experience. It is very easy for church members to focus inward on building issues, staff packages, local missions, and church school curricula. It is also easy to forget that there are 16 other UCC churches in our United Northern Association, and 155 other UCC churches in the Michigan Conference, all with similar concerns and hopes. But to be in the middle of 3,500 people from all corners not only of the nation, but the world, truly is an emotional experience that reminds us to look outside our local interests in addition to our own.

Worship was invigorating and fun. There is an element of camp music with encouragement to dance and swing your arms to the songs, but there is also much time for reflection in watching dancers bring the Word in a new way of expression. I heard thought-provoking sermons and voted on several resolutions that impact the national governance of our denomination as well as several national and international justice and mission endeavors.

In my discussion with the Board of Deacons, I will wait until September to begin leading sessions for us to talk about my experience, various resolutions, and any questions you may have about the UCC and/or Synod. If you prefer not to wait and have questions now, feel free to call, email, or drop by my office on Monday or Tuesday from 10am to noon.

Synod was very upbeat and hope-filled. Let us, as the theme invites us, imagine what's possible! Have a wonderful August.

What's New in the Library

All books added to the collection this month were donations. Thanks to all donors some of whom wish to remain anonymous. The first three are older books but are valuable for their historical information on the Congregational church & Christianity in America.

Saints and Strangers: *Being the Lives of the Pilgrim Fathers & their Families, with Their Friends & Foes; & an Account of Their Posthumous Wanderings in Limbo, Their Final Resurrection & Rise to Glory & the Strange Pilgrimages of Plymouth Rock...*(how is that for a title!)...Historical account of the group of people we know as the Pilgrims, how they got here & how the colony began.. Contains a bibliography of all settlers who stayed and were granted land by 1631. A valuable book for researchers.

The Devil in Massachusetts...an authentic history of the Salem witch trials. The book with the pace and excitement of a novel, is a timeless portrait of bigotry and self-righteousness. "In the end, one is pretty sure what was wrong with Cotton Mather, the august judges, and the tormented young girls." (quoting from the book blurb)

The Steward...provides the biblical background necessary to reconsider the origins of the idea of Christian stewardship and offers a corrective means for what the author considers a corruption of what stewardship was meant to be. This was donated from the library of Chet Kiefhaber.

The Choir that Couldn't Sing...the seven stories in this delightful book are surefire spirit lifters that celebrate life and enrich the soul, The stories come alive with humor, insight, and inspiration, demonstrating how the least in the kingdom of heaven can touch the heart of God.

Little Princes...the author volunteers for 3 months at a children's home in Kathmandu, Nepal. What he learns about the children (all victims of a lucrative trafficking scheme) and himself reshapes his perspective on life. *Little Princes* challenges the reader to examine their own values, set aside judgment and take some action to become and advocate for the vulnerable people that cross their paths.

There Ought to Be a Place...a history of the Congregational Summer Assembly as written by Russell W. Freeburg for the Assembly's Centennial Celebration in 2001. As the inscription reads " To the First Congregational, U.C.C., Benzonia. In respect of our shared Congregational heritage...(this book) ...is given to the year around "keepers of the faith" in Benzonia."
