I always associate February as the month of love. I'm sure most of that has to do with Valentine's Day, but also because it was the birth month of my Great Aunt Shirley who made the best fudge in the world (no offense to local fudge shops) and I have wonderful memories of playing cards with her.

There are two events coming up in February that continue our theme of love. On the first Sunday, our church will be participating in a new venture. We will have a booth at the Bridal Expo at the Grand Traverse Resort in Traverse City. This is an idea we were exploring just as I was leaving my previous church in Pennsylvania. One of the few times that non-church goers still come to church is for weddings. Also, many young people who decide to get married have no church affiliation and/or are frequently turned away from churches due to various reasons such as: no affiliation to the church, or one is Protestant and the other Catholic, or for inter-racial reasons. (In my seven years of ministry, I have married over twenty couples and the overwhelming majority were non-members who told me painful stories of being turned down by churches who did not accept the love shared between the couple.) Our church and denomination has a history of welcoming anyone and so it makes sense for us to advertise / evangelize to the folks who will attend a bridal show looking for florists, photographers, DJ's, that we would be there representing our church as an interested venue.

When I inquired with the organizer, he apologized for not having churches as a category. He said it never crossed his mind, but next year he will be marketing to local churches. This year, however, we will be the only church and the first church ever to request to participate. It's true that weddings could become a new source of revenue for our church, but even more is our hope that folks that do not have a church home will now have a place that will be special in their hearts and they may choose to return, that we would be a place for them to grow in love for each other as well as for our church and their faith.

Another new venture expanding on the theme of love, but in a different direction, is our Called to Care program. Several years ago, our church had an active team of trained Stephen's Ministers or lay people who visited with home-bound members and friends of our church. When we tried to resurrect this program recently, though we had interest, no one was able to complete the required trip to St. Louis for training. So we are now going to use the Called to Care program that does not require a trip for training other than to the church where I can lead the training. If you feel called by God to spend precious time with our church members and friends who have given much to the church in their lives and now need our support, care, and love, please let me know or contact the church office. We will be having our first informational meeting after church on Sunday, February 13, the day before Valentine's Day. Coincidence?

News from the Board of Trustees...

At the annual meeting on January 23, 2011, the congregation elected Carol Dye, Rob Wololwec, and current trustee, Jerry Slater, to three year terms, along with Andy Case and Ron Olson to complete unfilled terms on the Board of Trustees. They and trustees Dennis Richards and Earl Schopp are scheduled to meet on February 15 at 5:00 PM. Meetings are open to all and board members welcome congregational input.

According to the church by-laws, the Board of Trustees has the following charges: to superintend the raising and dispersing of all funds required for the corporate life of the church, provide proper supervision of all church properties and grounds, address personnel issues, have authority to hire all non-ministerial staff, and meet monthly.

Each month at our meeting, we consider assets, needs, and future desires, always remembering our church covenant that says, "we pledge loyalty to Christ and covenant with each other to strive to express the Spirit in our individual and corporate life, to live together as Christian brothers and sisters, and to support the ministry and mission of this church: working, giving, praying for its increase, its purity, its peace and seeking in every way to make it a power for the building of the Kingdom of God."

At our January 10 meeting, the Board of Trustees finalized the Proposed Budget for 2011 to be included with the 2010 Annual Report. We had to make some hard choices. The total amount proposed is \$205,081. This is a decrease of \$47,521 (19%) from last year's budget of \$252,602. Most operating budgets were reduced as well as staff time for Christian education and youth programs. Pastor Dan Furman is moving from Plan A health care coverage to Plan B. Repairs and maintenance to our buildings will be as necessary. Wider Missions will have reduced funds to distribute to community, national, and world missions.

But, as Pastor Dan pointed out in a sermon during Epiphany, we are a people of light. Our church will continue to spread that light as we minister to members, friends, our local community, and the worldwide community. At First Congregational Church, UCC, of Benzonia, we will continue to let God's light shine through us, we will continue to follow the example of Jesus, and we will continue to let the Holy Spirit instill us with hope.

Finding Time for Serenity...A series of 365 daily meditations urging women gently & persuasively to seek serenity in the midst of their harried lives. Author Crafton, wife, mother, grandmother, priest, writes from experience. She knows about the bags under the eyes, middle-age pride, kids leaving home. She becomes the wise and funny friend every woman needs every day. These short selections could work well as part of a Fellowship/Circle meditation.

Help, Lord! I'm Having a Senior Moment...Notes to God on Growing Older...While growing older certainly has plusses, it's downside poses big challenges. The author hits upon the things we least enjoy about getting older, but enables us to see God's hand in our "maturity". A short, entertaining read that will give you chuckles.

Front Porch Tales...Warm-hearted Stories of Family, Faith, Laughter, and Love...Phillip Gulley shares tender and hilarious real-life moments that capture the important truths of everyday life. Quoting the author, "A few of the names and events in this book have been altered to protect persons still living, namely me." Lets you know where these tales are going! Gulley is the author of the Harmony books, some of which we have on the shelf. Another good book for a gloomy day.

The Help...now after the collections of short tales, designed to give chuckles, perhaps you are ready for something a little heavier, more thought-provoking and totally engrossing. Set during the beginning of the civil rights movement in Jackson, Miss., where black women were trusted to raise white children but not to polish the household silver, it is a skillful depiction of the ironies and hypocrisies that defined the era. The author, born in the South, paints a picture of this time about we Northerners have little idea. This book was widely read; one of last year's best sellers.
